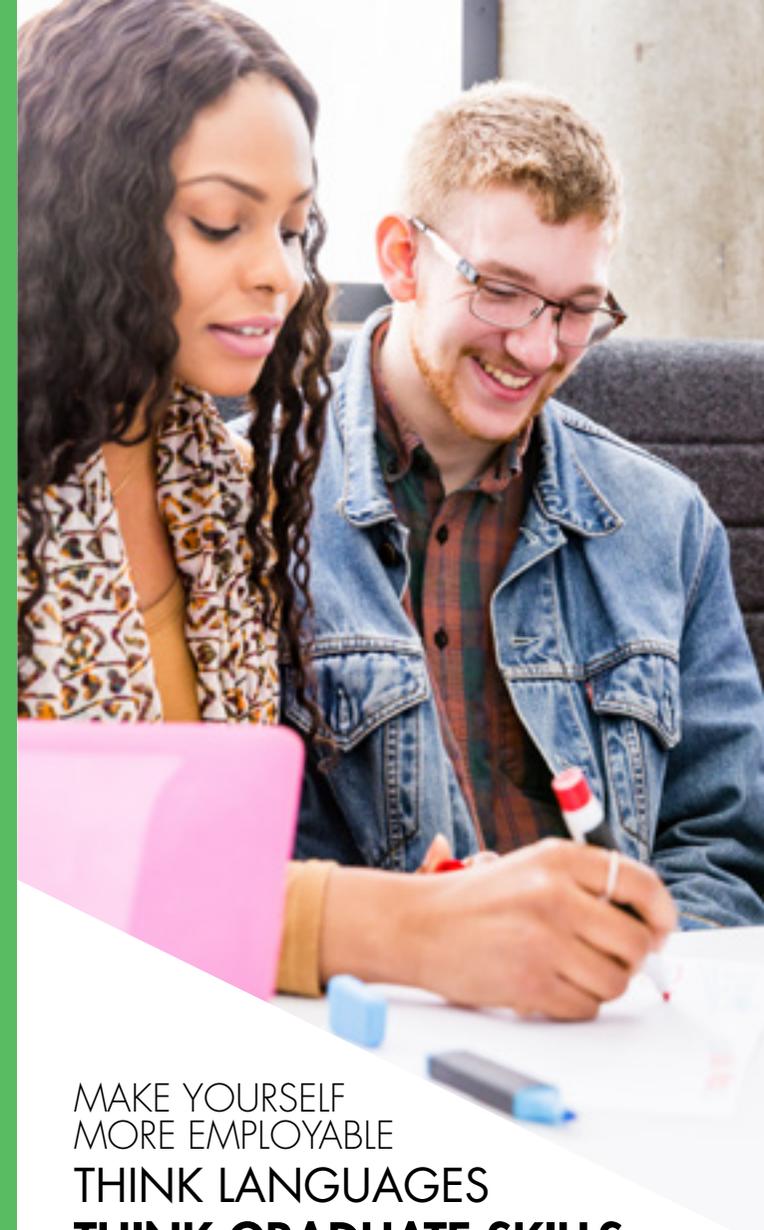
All **postgraduate students** should be aware that they need to pay an additional module fee to take a Polylang module. For details, see the website.

Polylang offers you the opportunity to study a foreign language at the University of Westminster as part of your course. You can study the following languages as an elective:

- **Arabic**
- **Chinese**
- **French**
- **German**
- **Italian**
- **Japanese**
- **Russian**
- **Spanish**

You can start a new language as a complete beginner or you can continue with a language you already have some knowledge of.

ABOUT POLYLANG

Polylang was established at the University of Westminster in 1991. Currently, there are more than 1,100 students taking one of our language modules, making it one of the largest and most established language programmes of its kind in the UK.

WHY STUDY A FOREIGN LANGUAGE?

Studying a foreign language will benefit you personally, professionally and financially:

- you will gain insights into other cultures and enhance your communication skills
- speaking a foreign language will make you more employable
- more than 85% of graduates who took Polylang found professional employment (DHLE survey)
- research shows that speakers of foreign languages have a higher earning potential.

HOW THE MODULES WORK

As an **undergraduate student**, you can join Polylang **without any additional cost** whenever your host course allows you to take an elective module:

- all modules carry credits and can potentially count towards your degree classification
- most languages and grades are offered at different times on different days to maximise the chances of fitting with your timetable
- teaching takes place in an atmosphere that is enjoyable and interactive
- online learning materials support your learning and help you make rapid progress.

As a **postgraduate student**, you should be aware that Polylang modules cannot contribute to a postgraduate award.

REGISTRATION

If you wish to join one of these modules, you need to register in person at one of our registration sessions.

A member of Polylang's academic staff will help you with your choice.

Please note that Polylang modules start later than other teaching in the University.
