Speculative applications

Don't just respond to adverts – make some speculative applications.

Contacting an employer in person, by telephone or by sending a covering letter and CV is also a good way of finding part-time employment.

Shops, bars and restaurants often advertise vacancies in their windows. Just go in and enquire whether they have any vacancies available.

Networking

It is worth asking your friends how they got their job and if their employer needs any more staff. Let all your family and friends know you are looking for part time work and you may find you hear about jobs before they are advertised.

Want to check if you have the right to work?

The Student Employment policy of the University recommends students do not work more than 20 hours per week in term time. Many international students are able to work in the UK part time during their studies. To check whether you are eligible to work, visit the Student Advice website: westminster.ac.uk/advice
