




Map 1.1. Places mentioned in the text (Base map: London c.1700)
























Map 3.1. Places mentioned in the text (Base map: London c.1y00).








Map 3.1. Places mentioned in the test (Base map London a 1850)




Map 3.3. Places exercisesed in the text (Buse maps London c.1890)






Emigrant Clergy Rending the late Decree that all who returns shall be put to Death .




Map 4.12. Places mentioned in the text (Base map: London c.1850)








Map 5.1. Places mentioned in the sert (fluse map: 2013)







Map 6.1. Places mentioned in the seet (Base map: London e.1850)

Map 8.1. Places mentioned in the test (Base map: London c.1910)




Map 9.1. Places mentioned in the test (flor map: Landon c.1850)



Map 30.1. Places mentioned in the test (Base map: Landon c.3910)
















































Map 13.1. Places mentioned in the test (Base maps London c.5930)
