During this workshop we will start by exploring questions of the lawscape and spatial justice through our movement in space. We will then find ways in which to relate our personal experiences of belonging, displacement, spatial identity, and justice to the wider issues of law and space. We will try out different methods in order to understand how best to conceptualise our connection with the urban space around us, thinking of past and future, human and animal, politics, history and law, always through our own personal experiences. We will then write down our first attempt at a manifesto about the lawscape and our rights within it, aiming at a substantive and not just formal spatial justice.
