

Scholarship Awards

- **You may only be awarded one scholarship from the University of Westminster**, and you acknowledge that any other University of Westminster scholarship which may have been awarded to you will be void upon signing and returning the Terms of Agreement to the Scholarships Office. You are permitted to have additional **external** scholarships.

Scholarship Conditions

- The scholarship cannot be transferred to another course or deferred to another year.
- The University of Westminster is unable to fund any additional costs to those listed in your terms of agreement. You must therefore confirm that you have the necessary funds to cover all other costs that may arise during your stay in London which may exceed the total award payable through the scholarship.
- The maintenance of your scholarship is subject to satisfactory academic performance as specified in your Terms of Agreement. If you experience serious academic difficulties (e.g. failing a module, filing mitigating circumstances, suspension, etc.) you must inform the Scholarships Office immediately.
- If you experience serious academic difficulties (e.g. failing a module, filing mitigating circumstances, suspension, etc.) or plan to withdraw you must inform the Scholarships Office immediately.
- The scholarship requires you to participate in a number of voluntary hours per academic year. It is your responsibility to find suitable volunteering activities to complete these hours, although the Scholarships Office may contact you throughout the year with opportunities. Any volunteering conducted outside of the University must be approved by the Scholarships Office first. All volunteering hours must be recorded on the Scholarships Volunteer Form and submitted to the Scholarships Office before the deadline.
