### Planning for Urban Risk and Resilience

Cities and their populations everywhere are facing a future of growing uncertainty and vulnerability. Planning frameworks and strategies will need to be adaptable to this growing risk. This module looks at spatial planning and urban design for risk management. It addresses reducing vulnerability and building urban resilience as it relates to longer-term climate change and other environmental threats, associated economic and political risks, public health and development needs. The module integrates sustainable development and climate change mitigation and adaptation concerns with disaster planning and urban risk management.

## The Business of Tourism

It examines the role and interdependence of the various components of the tourism industry, focusing on the operation of the tourism sector including transport, amenities, and attractions amongst other aspects

### Destination Development – Case Study Perspectives

Both UK and overseas destinations will be studied, ranging across resort, urban and rural settings.

This module is focused on the study of sustainability and green logistics, with a particular emphasis on freight transport. The first part of the module provides the context for sustainable supply chains, examining the business and public policy reasons for attempting to address sustainability issues, and examining how sustainability impacts are measured, monitored and reported. The second part of the module focuses on the freight transport element of supply chain management, looking at the strategic, operational and public policy perspectives.
