Visitor Visa Application Guide

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Who is this guide for?

This application guide was created for students coming to study for less than 6 months at the University of Westminster on a Standard Visitor Visa. Applications for the Standard Visitor Visa can be submitted outside UK only, in the country where the applicant holds a valid residency permit.

The guide explains how to set up a Home Office online account and gives tips about completing the Standard Visitor Visa application form. It does not cover all the Standard Visitor rules and requirements and it does not list all the documents needed, please see further information on our [website](#).

There are certain nationalities that can travel to the UK without making an application for a Standard Visitor visa and can obtain this visa at a UK airport. However, if you are a national of a '[visa national](#)' country, you must apply for your visa before coming to the UK. If you are not sure about your eligibility, see [our website for](#) more information or contact Student Advice via [Student Centre](#)

Before you apply

Have your offer letter in place. You should have an offer/letter confirming your studies at the University of Westminster

Check that your documents meet the Visitor Visa requirements. Your financial documents should prove you have enough money to support your visit. You must ensure you have included the following, along with all other relevant documents listed in the [Visitor visa guidance for documents](#) for applicants and [Visit Visa Supporting Documents Guide](#)

- Valid Passport
- Proof of Maintenance
- Confirmation of acceptance from the university

Be aware of fees and other expenses: Please note that there is no requirement for the Immigration Health Surcharge, and we advise you to arrange your own travel insurance. Standard Visitor visa application fee for 6 months length of stay from 9th of April 2025 is £127

General Information before submitting the visa application.

The maximum length of stay with a Standard Visitor Visa is 6 months. To apply for a Standard Visitor Visa to the UK, you need to:

- complete the application form and answer in English
- pay for the visa fee online (in most cases)

- provide your biometrics (fingerprints and facial photograph)

The standard processing time may vary depending on the country of application.

Priority Visa services are available for Standard Visitor Visa applications in most locations but there may be reduced availability. If available in your location, you will be able to purchase this on the TLS or VFS websites when you book your appointment to give biometrics. Super Priority Visa services are available for visitor visa applications in several of our locations with no change on availability.

To complete your application, you must provide your biometrics (fingerprints and facial photograph). This may involve attending a Visa Application Centre (VAC) operated by one of our commercial partners.

Once you have started your application you can save your form and complete it later.

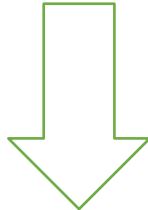
Starting your application

To access the Standard Visitor visa application form, go to www.gov.uk/standard-visitor/apply-standard-visitor-visa

Registering your account

To start the application process, use the above link and read the information provided on the main page. Then you should select 'Apply online' followed by 'Start now'. This will commence your application.

You will be required to provide your basic personal details to create your account.

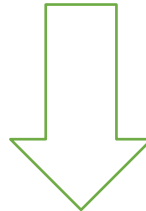
Once you've started your application you can save your form and complete it later.

If you're applying with family members, each person must have their own application and pay the fee. They need to attend their own appointment at a visa application centre.


You can apply on behalf of your partner and child, if they cannot apply for themselves.

- Select a country to provide your biometrics. You must provide your fingerprints and facial photograph which usually at visa application centre.

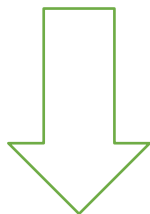

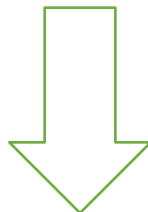

There is no set amount required, you should show sufficient funds that cover your travel expenses, accommodation and living costs including food expenses.



We would suggest to arrange similar amount per month as it is required for a Student visa which is £1,483 x number of months (i.e. £1,483 x 6 if you are planning to stay in the UK for 6 months).

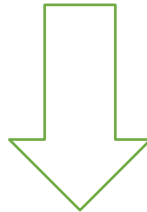

Travelling with another person

This refers to anyone who intends to travel to the UK with you apart from your partner, spouse, or dependents. If you are travelling to the UK with someone, you must provide details of their name, nationality, and relationship to you in this section.

For example, you may be travelling to the UK with your parent or your sibling; if this is the case, you would answer 'Yes' to this question.

It does not matter if they have not yet applied for a visa, you must still provide their details. It is ok for them to apply for their visa after you have applied for yours.

If you are travelling on your own, select 'No'.
