Our Vice-Chancellor and President, Professor Peter Bonfield, and Students' Union President, Divanshu Airan, are committed to working together and striving for the best possible student experience. They sat down to chat about all things Westminster...

Can you tell us about the opportunities for career development here at Westminster?

Divanshu: We put emphasis on making students 'future ready' after graduation. There is a whole team dedicated to career support, which includes career mentoring, CV and interview sessions. Teaching doesn't just focus on theory. The practical element is also very important.

Peter: With all our work-based learning embedded in the curriculum and then our career support – in particular our Westminster Enterprise Network, which helps people launch start-ups and find their way – there's a huge amount on offer. We have great employability links, not just in the UK but all around the world. Right from the beginning, we help our students think about their careers after graduation.

What makes our University distinctive and special?

D: First of all, it's diversity. We have students studying here from more than 160 countries. You can find students celebrating and sharing their different cultures and that's really a value and how we grow here. Westminster is a family – your home away from home.

We're in the heart of London – that really makes a difference. You can connect with different businesses and networks here and that can make you globally present.

Our Students' Union has just been named Students' Union of the Year by the National Centre for Diversity in their Top 100 Inclusive UK Employers Index 2024.

P: The diversity of our student and colleague community is really powerful. It's brilliant to be in this wide array of different views and perspectives on the world.

Our method of teaching, where we teach the theory and then get people to explore it and develop it is special.

We have our clubs and societies, our Dragons! Around 13,000 students are active in their club or society.

What advice would you give to students who are researching universities?

P: Ensure the course is something you're really interested in and want to study. Your career can work out afterwards, so choose something you really are curious about and will enjoy.

Make sure you choose a university within which you feel you belong and you're going to be at your happiest. Every university has a different personality, so choose one that fits you best. And the best way of finding out



that is to attend an Open Day and speak to existing students and ask them questions like, what does it feel like at Westminster?

D: View the values that the university has and the support that it provides to students. Where is the university located? We're located in the heart of London, which I believe adds to our inclusiveness and culture. How does the university approach teaching? Are they innovative and creative?

P: Also look at the facilities. Look at the places you're going to study in, because they're all key parts of the decision-making process. What's it going to be like to study here? So if you're a life scientist or artist or filmmaker or whatever, have a look at the place inside and see if it works for you too.



Westminster seeks to offer a truly global education to all of our students, should they wish. Do you want to see the world, take in a new culture or develop your language skills? We offer a range of global opportunities options including:

Student exchange - Study abroad for a term or a year to learn in a different education system and expand your horizons. We have more than 70 exchange partners in over 25 different countries.

Work abroad - Complete a semester or full-year international work placement and experience living and working in another country.

Global Experience Bursary - We offer funding to support students to go abroad over the summer to gain skills and experience including international internships, summer schools, language courses and volunteering.

Summer School Exchanges - Join an international summer school at one of our global university partners. Previous destinations have included Hong Kong, Rome and Copenhagen.

Academic field trips and course-related activities - Some courses offer opportunities for short international trips during the semester with your fellow students and led by your course leader. Or apply to join a course-specific placement, such as one of our internships at the UN Migration Agency or a clinical placement for Life Sciences students in Ghana.

Independent research shows that students from all backgrounds who engage in overseas mobility during their studies are more likely to achieve a higher degree classification and be in a better job with a higher starting salary than those who don't go abroad.

COURSE STRUCTURE AND ROUTES TO STUDY

Course structure

Bachelor of Arts (BA), Engineering (BEng), Law (LLB), Music (BMus) and Science (BSc) degree courses normally last three years full-time, or four years if you take a work/industrial placement year, or a year abroad. Undergraduate courses are modular and are taught over two semesters each academic year. Each module has a credit rating, and you gain credits for modules that you successfully complete. You continue to accumulate credits until you have gained enough for the award; an Honours degree requires a minimum of 360 credits.

At each credit level, you can choose from:

- core modules that must be studied
- option modules, where there is a choice within your subject area
- elective modules, where your course allows, giving a choice from outside your main subject area.

If you have recently been studying at another institution, you may be able to take a course at Westminster with credits already gained.

The criteria of the different bodies change from time to time, and if the University can give prior notification before the start of the academic year, you will be advised of changes that may affect your course.

Mature students

The vast majority of mature students who are accepted successfully complete their course, but returning to study can be challenging. To help you meet that challenge you will have access to tutorial support, and we provide a series of workshops on getting to grips with university life, and brushing up on your study skills. Formal qualifications are only one measure of your ability to study at a higher level. Work or other experience, maturity of approach, commitment and enthusiasm are also important. We take these factors into account when making offers of places.

Students of any age who have acquired certificated learning at an appropriate level can be exempted from specific modules, through the Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) system.

However, if you are 21 or over, the knowledge and skills which you have gained through life, work experience and study may make you eligible for credits towards your course under the Recognition of Prior Experiential Learning (RPEL) programme.




