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Teaching structure and term times

The academic year normally starts in September and finishes in June. Each year includes three-week vacations at Christmas and Easter. The confirmed term dates are published on our website at westminster.ac.uk/university-calendar

Teaching on full-time courses is split into modules lasting for one academic year or for one semester (half a year) if you're studying part-time.

WORKING TOGETHER, FOR YOU

Our Vice-Chancellor and President, Professor Peter Bonfield, and Students' Union President, Adil Musani, are committed to working together and striving for the best possible student experience.

Can you tell us about the opportunities for career development here at Westminster?

Peter: We have lots of support to help every student find their direction. It starts with the learning experience. We teach through "authentic learning", so students learn by doing: they go on field trips and employers come into the University, linking study to real work.

Alongside this, we provide careers and enterprise support. Through the Westminster Enterprise Network, around one in five students goes on to set up their own business. Students can get guidance on marketing, legal basics and the steps involved in starting a company, plus access to our Ignite and Elevate funds to help launch start-ups. Much of this will be brought together in Zone29, our new nine-storey building next to our Marylebone Campus designed for careers, enterprise and industry connections.

We also run Westminster Working Cultures, giving students chances to visit organisations overseas and learn directly from employers. Recent trips have included Dubai and Singapore, where students visited companies, met leaders and asked questions about careers. We have a mentoring scheme and the Westminster Award with levels from bronze to

platinum, helping students build and evidence the skills employers look for. Thousands of students take part each year.

Adil: As a student, that's been my experience too. There's a lot available and students are keen to use it. I've benefited from mentoring, CV guidance and interview preparation. What makes Westminster different, for me, is that it isn't only theoretical: we learn the theory and apply it, which makes study feel more relevant and helps students feel ready for their future careers.

P: That applied approach is reflected in assessment as well. Rather than memory tests, we focus on developing skills and competencies, supporting each student to grow their strengths and overcome barriers that could hold them back. Careers support continues after graduation too: our services remain available for at least three years. Many alumni return as mentors, and our worldwide alumni community can help students wherever they want to work.

What makes our University distinctive and special?

A: The Students' Union and the Dragons community create a real sense of belonging. We have students from around 160 countries studying together as one Westminster family, and cultures are valued as well as celebrated.

P: I agree. Westminster is diverse, welcoming and supportive, and people can feel safe to be themselves. Belonging is one part; the way we educate is another - collaborative, practical

learning in studios, labs and specialist spaces. And studying in London brings powerful opportunities to build networks and move into work.

What advice would you give to prospective students who are researching universities?

A: Look at the location, how diverse the community is, what career support is available and how involved students are. Go to open days and get a feel for the place.

P: Start with wellbeing and the fit: every university has its own personality, so choose the one where you'll belong and thrive. Then check the course, how it's taught, the facilities and the people you'll learn from. Finally, consider practicalities like travel and where you might live, trust your instinct, and enjoy the process.


Cavendish Campus, situated in central London, is within a few minutes' walk of Oxford Street, Tottenham Court Road and Soho.

Our **physiology lab** is equipped with exercise machines and cardiovascular and nutritional assessment equipment. There are specialist facilities for measuring body composition, including the BodPod and Galileo.



We have four floors of **state-of-the-art laboratories**, ranging from large labs for practical teaching sessions, to spaces with specialist equipment, such as cell culture facilities and DNA sequencing.



Our recently revamped **psychology spaces** include individual and group research labs, plus specialist labs for psychobiology and psychophysiology, Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation and EEG (electroencephalogram).

Our **specialist lab** caters for the hardware layer aspects of computer system engineering.



Our **brand-new Immersive Development Lab** is led by professionals from the gaming industry. The lab includes the latest VR/XR technologies, 3D printers and cameras, green screens and more.



We have **over 30 specialist labs**, including cyber security and forensics, Mac, and gaming labs, with various operating systems, software and VR hardware.



Our campuses offer various **study and social spaces**, all equipped with wifi, power outlets and comfortable seating.



Our **lecture theatres** are home to your larger teaching sessions, where you'll learn from our academic experts alongside your classmates.



Cavendish Campus is home to the **library and student centre** for both Regent and Cavendish campuses. You can loan learning resources, study in our quiet areas or book a group study space.

The University has three campuses in central London and one in Harrow, north-west London.


Harrow Campus, situated in north-west London and a short London Underground ride away from central London, is a collaborative hub of creativity, design and innovation.

Our **Broadcasting Suite** features a functioning classroom, **TV-style set and gallery, green screen and podcasting facilities**.



Our **professional standard photography spaces** feature a suite of photography equipment, studios and darkrooms, plus print, digital and finishing facilities.

Our music facilities include **surround and Dolby Atmos recording studios, rehearsal rooms and performance spaces**.



Our facilities include **film and TV studios, gallery, sound control, dressing rooms, green rooms, set building workshops and editing suites** equipped with professional standard software.



Our design students have their own dedicated studio equipped with individual design spaces, **industrial sewing machines, pattern cutting tables and mannequins**.




Our **library** has a range of books and resources on subjects taught at our Harrow Campus, along with group, individual and distanced individual study spaces.








Our Regent Street building is in the heart of central London, close to Oxford Circus station and hundreds of shops, cafes and restaurants.

309 Regent Street is our flagship building and dates back to 1838, when we first opened as the Royal Polytechnic Institution.

Our historic Regent Street Cinema - the birthplace of British cinema in 1896 - is located within our University headquarters at 309 Regent Street. University of Westminster students receive a discount on tickets.




We have a range of learning and teaching spaces including classrooms and seminar rooms, plus active learning spaces designed for group working and projects.

Personal tutors

Every undergraduate student at the University of Westminster is assigned a personal tutor who serves as a primary point of contact for academic guidance. You can meet with your tutor to discuss module selection, enhance your study skills or address any issues affecting your studies. If necessary, your personal tutor can also refer you to specialised services such as Disability Learning Support or the University's Counselling Service.

Learn a language

Strengthen your CV and broaden your horizons with Polylang, our open language programme. Study a new language – or advance one you already know – alongside your degree, with options including Arabic, Chinese, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Russian and Spanish.

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

Explore the world while getting your degree

Westminster seeks to offer a truly global education to all of our students. Do you want to see the world, take in a new culture or develop your language skills? We offer a range of global opportunities options including:

Student exchange: Study abroad for a term or a year to learn in a different education system and expand your horizons. We have more than 70 exchange partners in over 25 different countries.

Work abroad: Complete a semester or full-year international work placement and experience living and working in another country.

Global Experience Bursary: We offer funding to support students to go abroad over the summer to gain skills and experience including international internships, summer schools, language courses and volunteering.

Our overseas opportunities come with the chance to apply for funding including via our in-house Global Experience Bursaries and external Government funding schemes. Funding opportunities are reviewed on a yearly basis.

Westminster Working Cultures (WWC): Fully-funded professional opportunities to experience working cultures in the UK and 13 global cities overseas.

Summer School Exchanges: Join an international summer school at one of our global university partners. Previous destinations have included Hong Kong, Rome and Copenhagen.

Academic field trips and course-related activities: Some courses offer opportunities to go on short international trips during the semester with your fellow students and led by your course leader. Or apply to join a course-specific placement, such as one of our internships at the UN Migration Agency or a clinical placement for Life Sciences students in Ghana.

Independent research shows that students from all backgrounds who engage in overseas mobility during their studies are more likely to achieve a higher degree classification and secure a better job with a higher starting salary than those who don't go abroad.

COURSE STRUCTURE AND ROUTES TO STUDY

Course structure

Bachelor of Arts (BA), Engineering (BEng), Law (LLB), Music (BMus) and Science (BSc) degree courses normally last three years full-time, or four years if you do a placement or study abroad year. Courses are modular and are taught over two semesters each academic year. Each module has a credit rating, and you gain credits for modules that you successfully complete. An Honours degree requires a minimum of 360 credits. Courses include core and option modules; see course pages online for details.

If you have recently been studying at another institution, you may be able to take a course at Westminster with credits already gained.

The criteria of the different bodies change from time to time, and if the University can give prior notification

before the start of the academic year, you will be advised of changes that may affect your course.

Mature students

We welcome applications from mature students and consider experience alongside any existing qualifications. Mature students have access to tutorial support and we provide a series of workshops on getting to grips with university life and brushing up on your study skills.

Students of any age who have acquired certificated learning at an appropriate level can be exempted from specific modules, through the Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) system. However, if you are 21 or over, the knowledge and skills which you have gained through life, work experience and study may make you eligible for credits towards your course under the Recognition of Prior Experiential Learning (RPEL) programme.


